AMERICA'S BOATING COURSE IN SOUTHOLD

The United States Power Squadrons will present "America's Boating Course®" (ABC), beginning at 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 1 at the First Presbyterian Church in Southold.

ABC is approved by NY State and is the finest course available for boaters to comply with the NY state boater education law, as it provides essential information for new boaters or serves as a great brush up for experienced boaters. The course is also approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators and the U.S. Coast Guard.

The five sessions (continues 5/8, 5/15, 5/22 & 5/29) will cover boating law, safety equipment, safe boating practices, navigation, boating emergencies, personal watercraft, charts, GPS, trailering and much more. Attendees will receive a 244-page America's Boating Course manual, and after passing an exam, a completion certificate will be issued. Many insurance companies offer discounts to boaters who earn their completion certificate.

The First Presbyterian Church is located at 53100 Route 25 in Southold. The \$50-fee covers the cost of the manual. Students must be at least 10 years of age on or before May 29, 2019. The course is sponsored by the Southold Free Library and presented locally by Peconic Bay Power Squadron, Eastern Long Island's local unit of the United States Power Squadrons.

New York State law requires operators of mechanically propelled vessels in NY waters (who must be over 10 years old), born on or after May 1, 1996 to be holders of a boating safety certificate. Exemptions include: minors between 10 and 18 must have a certificate unless accompanied by an adult certificate holder, new boat owners within a 120-day grace period, boating safety instructors, US Power Squadron members, USCGA members, licensed captains, or on duty emergency service, rescue and law enforcement personnel.

CHANGE IN MAKO REGULATIONS FOR 2019

The National Marine Fisheries
Service (NMFS) has amended the 2006
Consolidated Atlantic Highly Migratory
Species (HMS) Fishery Management
Plan (FMP) based on the results of the
2017 stock assessment and a subsequent binding recommendation by the
International Commission for the Con-

servation of Atlantic Tunas (ICCAT) for North Atlantic shortfin make sharks. The ruling establishes a minimum size limit of 71 inches fork length (FL) for male and 83 inches FL for female shortfin mako sharks, regardless of where and when recreational anglers target them. This final rule went into effect on March 3 of this year. The North Atlantic shortfin make shark stock is overfished and is experiencing overfishing. Consistent with the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act (Magnuson-Stevens Act) and the Atlantic Tunas Convention Act (ATCA), NMFS is implementing management measures that will reduce fishing mortality on shortfin mako sharks and establish a foundation for rebuilding the shortfin mako shark population consistent with legal requirements.
